## Tree Removal Notices

## July 2012

Recently, arborists identified five European Birch trees on UBC land, at Totem Park Residence, that are dying and have large dead parts. Their removal is necessary as they pose an immediate risk to the public. The removal of these dead trees will be completed July 30, 2012.

## August 2012

Recently, UBC arborists identified two trees, a Western Red Cedar and a Douglas Fir at Buchanan E that are either dead or 90% dead. They recommended that these trees be removed because they pose a risk to the public. The date of removal is scheduled by UBC Building Operations for Saturday, August 25th in order to minimize disruption to classes and offices in the area. Some pedestrian areas will need to be cordoned off, however every effort will be made to minimize disruption to pedestrian, bicycle and vehicle routes.

## October 2012

UBC arborists identified two trees, a Western Red Cedar and a Western Hemlock, in Acadia Park that are dead. They recommended that these trees be removed. The date of removal is scheduled by UBC Building Operations for Friday, October 26th.

## November 2012

UBC arborists have recommended the felling of 17 dead trees, including Douglas Firs, a Western Hemlock and a Red Alder, located to the west of UBC Farm buildings. A network of footpaths through the forested area were recently created to allow the public and forestry students to study and observe the area. The 17 dead trees are within vicinity of these pathways and are therefore now a hazard to the public. The date of removal will be scheduled by UBC Building Operations.
